Am I Subject to this subpart?	I. This subpart applies to: (A) Manufactures of pharmaceutical product which process, use, or produce HAPs and are located at plant site that is a major source. (B) "Pharmaceutical product" means any of the following, except for nonreactive solvents, excipient, binder, or filler or any material produced in a chemical manufacturing process units that is subject to subpart F and G of this part: (1) Any material described by SIC code 2833 or 2834; (2) Any material whose manufacturing process is described by NAICS code 325411 or 325412; (3) A finished dosage form of a drug (e.g., tablet, capsule, solution, etc.); (4) Any active ingredient or precursor that is produced at a facility whose primary manufacturing operations are described by SIC code 2833 or 2834; (5) At facilities whose primary operations are not described by SIC code 2833 or 2834, any material

	who's primary use is as an active ingredient or precursor. *Major Sources of HAPs emit or have the potential to emit: (1) ≥ 10 tons/year of any single HAP; or (2) ≥ 25 tons/year of total HAPs. Area Sources emit less than Major Sources. II. Exempt to this Subpart: (A) Research and development facilities
