Am I Subject to this subpart?	I. This subpart applies to: (A) Triple superphosphate plants with a design capacity of more than 15 tons of P ₂ O ₅ feed per calendar day; and that commence construction or modification after October 22, 1974 (B) Affected facilities: (1) Mixers; (2) Curing belts (dens); (3) Reactors; (4) Granulators; (5) Dryers; (6) Coolers; (7) Screens; (8) Mills; (9) Facilities that store run-of-pile triple superphosphate (C) Standards apply to fluorides
