40 CFR Part 60 Subpart AAAA	Small Municipal Waste Combustion Units for Which Construction is Commenced After August 30, 1999 or for Which Modification or Reconstruction is Commenced After June 6, 2001

Am I Subject to this subpart?	I. This subpart applies to: (A) Small municipal waste combustion (MWC) units that commence construction after August 30, 1999 (B) Small MWC units that commence modification or reconstruction after June 6, 2001 (C) A small MWC unit has the capacity to combust at least 35 tons per day but no more than 250 tons per day of municipal solid waste or refuse-derived fuel (D) Physical or operational changes made to an existing MWC unit primarily to comply with NSPS BBBB do not qualify as modifications or reconstruction II. Not subject to this subpart*: (A) Small MWC units that combust less than 11 tons/day; (B) Qualifying small power production facilities (per Section 3(17)(C) of the Federal Power Act, 16 USC 796(17)(C)); (C) Qualifying cogeneration facilities (per Section 3(18)(B) of the Federal Power Act, 16 USC 796(18)(B)); (D) MWC units that combust only tires; (E) Hazardous waste combustion units with a permit under Section 3005 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act; (F) Materials recovery units; (G) Co-fired combustors; (H) Plastics/rubber recycling units; (I) Units that combust fuels made from products of plastics/rubber recycling plants;

	(J) Cement kilns III. Partially Exempt*: (A) Air curtain incinerators that combust 100% yard waste. *These facilities must still comply with certain requirements (per 40 CFR 60.1020). Please see the rule text for full details
