

PUBLIC NOTICE
Nebraska Department of Water, Energy, and Environment
Permitting and Engineering Division

Notice is given to the public, according to Chapter 10 of Title 129 - Nebraska Air Quality Regulations as amended September 28, 2022, that the Department is proposing to issue a Class I operating permit to CNH Industrial America, LLC (FID# 024371) for a farm machinery and equipment manufacturing facility (Standard Industrial Classification code 3523) located at 3445 W. Stolley Park Rd, Grand Island, Hall County, Nebraska. The potential emissions of regulated air pollutants (in tons per year (tpy)) at this facility will be: 18.11 tpy of Particulate Matter (PM), 14.30 tpy of $PM \leq 10$ microns (PM_{10}), 13.58 tpy $PM \leq 2.5$ microns ($PM_{2.5}$), 0.81 tpy Sulfur Dioxide, 104.61 tpy Oxides of Nitrogen, 86.53 tpy Carbon Monoxide, 313.75 tpy Volatile Organic Compounds, 7.98 tpy of 1-Butanol (largest quantity individual Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs), 13.02 tpy total HAPs, and 124,331 tpy Greenhouse Gases CO_2 , 125,005 equivalents (CO_2e).

Hall County meets the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for those pollutants subject to a NAAQS and is expected to continue in that status. Hall County is unclassifiable in regard to the state Total Reduced Sulfur (TRS) standards and no TRS emissions are expected from this project. No impact is anticipated on habitat for any rare or threatened species.

The Nebraska Department of Water, Energy, and Environment (DWEE) propose to issue a Class I operating permit with specific conditions, based on Title 129, which authorizes limits on VOC and organic HAP emissions from surface coatings operations; specifies requirements from federal NSPS rules (40 CFR 60) for Subparts A, Dc and JJJJ; specifies requirements from federal NESHAP rules (40 CFR 63) for subparts A, and ZZZZ; specifies Title 129, Chapter 14*; Title 129 Chapter 14 requirements for the paint burn-off ovens; specifies inspection, operation, maintenance, and monitoring requirements; and specifies recordkeeping and reporting requirements.

The proposed permit and supporting materials are available for inspection by the public Friday, August 14th, 2026, through Monday, September 14th, 2026, at the office of the DWEE, 245 Fallbrook Boulevard, Suite 100, Lincoln, Nebraska, and electronically at <https://dwee.nebraska.gov/>. Comments received during this period will be considered prior to the final decision. During this period the applicant, or any interested person or group of persons, may request or petition the Director for a public hearing, the request must state the nature of the issues to be raised and all arguments and factual grounds supporting their position. If a public hearing is granted by the Director, the hearing will be advertised by public notice at least 30 days prior to the hearing.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the 30-day comment period, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was not practicable to raise such objection within such period.
